CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Breaking New Ground

With ISAS poised to celebrate its first decade of dedicated studies and focussed public outreach activities, the institute looks forward to pursuing our mission with even greater vigour in the years to come.

The year 2013/2014 was an important year for ISAS. It was a year of intense activity and it was a year which saw our global signature event, 'South Asian Diaspora Convention' gaining considerable traction. The Convention brought together people from different countries of South Asia living in various parts of the world engaged in a wide variety of business and civic activities. The event which took place in November 2013 saw the participation of political leaders like Singapore's two Deputy Prime Ministers and the Foreign Minister, the former Finance Minister of India, Mr P Chidambaram, Prof Gowher Rizvi from Bangladesh and prominent businessmen like Anand Mahindra from India, Abdul Razak Dawood from Pakistan and Binod Chaudhary from Nepal.

SADC 2013 broke new ground in two ways. First it initiated the process of reaching out to the World Bank with two of their senior officials attending and contributing at the Conference. The proposition is to access the World Bank to facilitate a smooth flow of the South Asian Diaspora's skills and potential investments towards South Asia. The World Bank could either partner the Diaspora-investors or provide them with comfort against some specific forms of risk generally associated with investing

in South Asia. Linking South Asia with its Diaspora will be consistent with the World Bank's development mandate. For the Diaspora investors, risk-mitigated investment, made possible by the World Bank, will make it more attractive for them to invest in the region they have emigrated from. Overtime this could lead to greater regional economic integration and this in turn could bring in FDI from non-South Asian sources. It will be the first significant step in a long journey.

The second ground breaking event at SADC was the recognition of entrepreneurial success achieved by the South Asian Diaspora members. In a high-profile celebration of enterprise, Singapore's President, Dr Tony Tan Keng Yam, presented the 'Outstanding Member of the South Asian Diaspora Award' (OMSADA) to Mr Murli Kewalram Chanrai, Chairman of the Kewalram Chanrai Group, a US\$ 1-billion global company at a glittering Gala Dinner on the first day of SADC 2013.

Consistent with our broad mandate, ISAS has gone the extra mile in meaningful public-outreach activities. In July 2013, we hosted a Public Lecture by India's then External Affairs Minister Salman Khurshid. Indeed, in the year under review, ISAS took a bold initiative of



holding a series of public fora to discuss the issues, trends, and personalities in India's General Election 2014. Right up to the polling days in April-May 2014 and beyond, ISAS continued to use the public platform to discuss India's political and economic trend-lines in the context of what turned out to be a defining General Election. These public discussions in Singapore proved popular.

ISAS has also held activities covering the other countries of South Asia. Mention should be made of the launch of The Encyclopedia of the Sri Lankan Diaspora at the SADC 2013. An ISAS Colombo Colloquium was also organised on 3 April 2014. Sri Lanka's Foreign Minister, Prof G L Peiris, was a notable participant when the Encyclopedia was launched in Sri Lanka.

During the year, ISAS has developed close professional links with certain

international organisations. Issues of combating terrorism and violent extremism in South Asia have been extensively explored by ISAS, in partnership with the New York-based Center on Global Counterterrorism Cooperation (which later became the Global Center on Cooperative Security) and the United Nations Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate. The objective is to facilitate the involvement of the South Asian civil society in the implementation of the UN counter-terrorism strategy. I should commend, in particular, the efforts of Dr Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury, Principal Research Fellow at ISAS and a former Foreign Minister of Bangladesh, in making this exercise possible.

At a different level, I should also mention the partnership-memoranda that ISAS has signed with Brookings, India and the Lakshman Kadirgamar Institute for

International Relations and Strategic Studies in Colombo.

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Synergising Research Efforts

Having settled down at our new premises, we are looking forward to celebrating the 10th anniversary of the founding of ISAS and the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Singapore and India.

I am happy to report that ISAS monitored, virtually on a real-time basis, the rapid and complex political and economic developments in South Asia, especially India and Pakistan, during FY2013/14. The long and sensitive countdown to India's General Election 2014, as well as the return of Nawaz Sharif to power in Pakistan in 2013 and that country's democratic challenges, have been amply explored in ISAS research papers. On foreign policy issues, the unusual two-in-a-year summit meetings between India and China in 2013, as well as the bloodless but tense military standoff between them, were also watched closely and commented upon.

Besides keeping abreast of current developments in South Asia, ISAS reinforced its focus on longer-term academic research on themes of contemporary relevance to the sub-continent. Streamlining our research areas for greater synergy, we created five Research Programmes – Politics and Governance; Security and International Relations; Strategic and Multilateral Linkages; Trade and Economics; and Singapore, Southeast Asia and Diaspora. Researchers' meetings are held regularly, twice a week whenever possible, to discuss

research themes and current affairs of direct relevance to South Asia.

In the year under review and the following months, some notable developments have taken place at the Institute. While we have had a fairly compact and stable research team over the past several years, I wish to place on record our appreciation of the scholarly work of Prof S D Muni, who moved on from ISAS in early-January 2014 after a number of years of close association with this Institute. We have welcomed on board Assoc Prof Rahul Mukherji as Head of Research and Honorary Senior Fellow, and Dr Rajesh Rai as Assistant Director and Senior Research Fellow. Dr S Narayan, who served as Head of Research for a number of years and whose association with ISAS can be traced to its formative phase, stays on as Visiting Senior Research Fellow. ISAS has, in concert with its stakeholders, launched a new initiative, hosting Dr Duvvuri Subbarao, former Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, as the first Distinguished Visiting Fellow.

Our research output – in the form of ISAS Briefs, Insights, Working Papers, and Special Reports – has remained quite impressive in scope and substance, looking at current and



long-term issues of relevance to South Asia (with a touch of history where appropriate). The future of Afghanistan in the context of the likely pullout of US troops from there, the growing importance of Indian Ocean, the connectivity between India's Northeast and Southeast Asia, Singapore's relations with India, the changing internal and international profile of India (including its relations with major powers), and the developments in Pakistan, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka continue to animate our intellectual pursuits. These subjects have been covered not only in our research papers but also in our newsletters.

Several books by ISAS scholars have been published during FY2013/14 and in the following months – *Diaspora Engagement and Development in South Asia*, edited by Tan Tai Yong and

Md Mizanur Rahman; *The Political Economy of South Asian Diaspora*, edited by Gopinath Pillai; *Political Economy of Reforms in India*, by Rahul Mukherji; *Globalization and Deregulation: Ideas, Interests, and Institutional Change in India*, by Rahul Mukherji; *The Trans-Pacific Partnership, China, and India: Economic and Political Implications*, by Amitendu Palit; *Being Muslim in South Asia: Diversity and Daily Life*, edited by Robin Jeffrey and Ronojoy Sen; *Indians in Singapore 1819-1945: Diaspora in the Colonial Port City*, by Rajesh Rai; *Migrant Remittances in South Asia: Social, Economic and Political Implications*, edited by Md Mizanur Rahman, Tan Tai Yong, and AKM Ahsan Ullah (the last mentioned editor being an external scholar).

A notable event in the life of ISAS during FY2013/14 was the relocation of our office from the Bukit Timah

Campus of the National University of Singapore to an enclave that houses some international organisations such as APEC Secretariat, Asia-Europe Foundation, and UNDP Centre of Excellence, etc. Having settled down at our new premises, we are looking forward to celebrating the 10th anniversary of the founding of ISAS and the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Singapore and India.





2013

1 April

India

The Supreme Court in a landmark verdict rejects Swiss firm Novartis' plea for a patent for modification of Glivec, a drug that fights a form of chronic blood cancer. Green signal for cheaper generic drugs.

Nepal

Supreme Court suspends attempt by the government to set up a Truth and Reconciliation Commission to investigate crimes committed during the country's 10-year civil war.

3 April

Afghanistan

Taliban militants disguised as soldiers attack a courthouse in the capital of the Farhan province and try to free Taliban prisoners on trial. The attack leaves 50 people dead and another 90 injured.

7 April

Bangladesh

The Norwegian Trade Minister Mr Trond Giske met Foreign Minister Dr Dipu Moni. He said Telenor would invest more in Bangladesh, especially in 3G services through Grameen phone. He also expressed his country's interest to invest in shipbuilding/recycling and oil and gas sectors of Bangladesh.

19 April

Bangladesh

The 1st Bangladesh-Bhutan-India trilateral meeting on connectivity and transit was held on 19 April 2013 in Dhaka. The Bangladesh delegation was led by Ms Mashfee Binte Shams, Director General (South Asia), Ministry of Foreign Affairs; the Bhutanese delegation was led by Mr Dasho Bap Kesang, Ambassador of Bhutan in Bangladesh and the Indian delegation was led by Mr Virendra Kumar, Director (Works), Ministry of Railways. The meeting was held in a friendly and cordial atmosphere.

Pakistan

Court orders the arrest of Gen Pervez Musharraf over his attempt to impose house arrest on judges during his military rule in March 2007. He returned from British exile in March to contest parliamentary elections.

9 April

Bangladesh

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated Air Force Base Bangabandhu at Kurmitola. Bangladesh Air Force stepped into a new era with the induction of avant garde aircraft. The aircraft include F-7BG-1 and FT-7BG-1 fighter planes and MI-171 SH helicopters. The government had been working towards developing the armed forces through modernising the army, navy and air force.

22 April

Bangladesh

Parliament elects Abdul Hamid as Bangladesh's new president, following the death in March of Zillur Rahman. Abdul Hamid, the speaker of Bangladesh's parliament, has been elected unopposed as president. Hamid is a 69-year-old stalwart of the ruling Awami League party who has been serving as acting president after the death of his predecessor Zillur Rahman on March 20.

23 April

Bangladesh

Two Joint Working Groups on trade and shipping have been launched to realise the potential for enhanced trade and connectivity between Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. The agreements were signed when Foreign Secretary Md Shahidul Haque and his Sri Lankan counterpart Karunatilaka Amunugama met at the second Foreign Office Consultation in Colombo. Officials reviewed the relations between the two countries and discussed the progress made in implementing the decisions made during the visit of Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa to Bangladesh in 2011 and at the fourth Joint Economic Commission in 2012.

24 Apr

Bangladesh

Rana Plaza, an eight-story commercial building, collapsed in Savar, a sub-district in the Greater Dhaka Area, the capital of Bangladesh. The search for the dead ended on 13 May with the death toll of 1,129. Approximately 2,515 injured people were rescued from the building.

3 May

Pakistan

Chaudhry Zulfiqar Ali, a Pakistani special prosecutor working on the Benazir Bhutto murder case, was shot dead in Islamabad while driving to court.

2 May

Pakistan

Indian prisoner, Sarabjit Singh succumbed to injuries sustained during a scuffle with fellow inmates, at Jinnah Hospital, Lahore. Conversely, the government of Pakistan strongly condemned the death of Pakistani prisoner Sanaullah on 9 May in a hospital in Chandigarh, India, succumbing to the brutal injuries inflicted upon him during an attack in a jail in the Indian Kashmir.

29 April

Afghanistan

President Karzai has admitted that the CIA had been dropping off bags of cash, totalling tens of millions of dollars, at his office for more than a decade.

26 April

Bangladesh

The 39th meeting of the Commonwealth Ministerial Action Group (CMAG) deliberated on developments in Fiji and discussed several country and thematic situations informally. Foreign Minister Dr Dipu Moni, MP chaired the meeting held at London's Mulborough House.

5 May**India**

China ends three-week stand-off and pulls out troops from Daulat Beg Oldi sector in Ladakh.

Bangladesh

Following a violent protest by Hefajat-e Islam, an extremist organisation, the government's used more than 10,000 police and military forces to suppress the violence. Much of the day's events were telecast live on national television before the government ended coverage. Several sources reported that more than 30 were dead.

6 May**India**

The Supreme Court clears the decks for the commissioning of the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Plant in Tamil Nadu.

10 May**Bangladesh**

Woman found alive in rubble 17 days after collapse - Reshma Begum survived on biscuits and by breathing through a pipe amid wreckage of Rana Plaza in Dhaka, and was rescued.

11 May**Pakistan**

General Elections held on 11 May. Taliban conduct systematic campaign of attacks and intimidation, but fail to deter largest turnout of voters since 1970. A week later, a senior member of Imran Khan's Movement for Justice (PTI) party, Zahra Shahid, was shot dead outside her home in Karachi.

29 May**India**

India and Japan sign a joint statement on speeding up talks on civil nuclear deal after summit-level talks between Prime Ministers Manmohan Singh and Shinzo Abe in Tokyo.

23 May**India**

The Union Cabinet decides to grant 'classical' language status for Malayalam.

21 May**India**

Defence Secretary Shashi Kant Sharma is appointed as the 12th Comptroller and Auditor-General.

20 May**Afghanistan**

President Karzai visits India to seek greater military aid from the Indian Government during his India visit.

India

India and China sign eight agreements, including one to increase the frequency of exchange of hydrological data.

17 May**Bangladesh**

Foreign Minister Dr Dipu Moni met US Secretary of State John Kerry.

30 May**Bangladesh**

A reserve of magnetic rock used to produce iron has been found at Makshidpur of Hakimpur upazila in Dinajpur – for the first time in Bangladesh, says the Geological Survey of Bangladesh (GSB). Apart from the magnetic rock reserve, the GSB has also found a 10-foot thick layer of limestone during an exploration under the second phase of a geo-scientific project for mineral resources.

India

India and Thailand sign an Extradition Treaty, after talks between Prime Ministers Manmohan Singh and Yingluck Shinawatra in Bangkok.

31 May to 13 July**Bhutan**

National Assembly Election held 2nd ever parliamentary elections in the country. It had a turnout of about 80%.

1 June**Afghanistan**

Afghanistan army takes command of all military and security operations from NATO forces.

India

N R Narayana Murthy is reappointed Infosys Chairman two years after his retirement. His son Rohan Murthy was appointed his "Executive Assistant."

16 June**Bangladesh**

The Child Bill 2013, passed on June 16, 2013 by the National Parliament, was published through a gazette notification on June 20. The new act is harmonised with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) and has referred to the CRC in the preamble and replaced the Child Act 1974.

14 June**Bangladesh**

The US Labor Department will give \$2.5m (£1.6m) to help improve the enforcement of fire and safety standards and ensure better protection of workers. The grants come amid concerns over safety standards in Bangladesh's garment factories, one of the biggest employers in the country.

5 June**Afghanistan**

Staff Sergeant Robert Bales is accused of killing 16 Afghanistan civilians in two villages. The soldier pleads guilty in order to avoid the death penalty. Residents of the Afghanistan village where the rampage took place are angered that he escaped the death penalty.

Pakistan

Nawaz Sharif takes oath as Prime Minister of Pakistan, following the Pakistan Muslim League (N)'s victory (166 seats) in the 2013 general election; vowing to improve relations with India and ease decades of mistrust. PTI won 35 seats while PPP won 45 seats.

Afghanistan President Hamid Karzai walks out of talks with the Taliban in Doha following controversy over their embassy. The nameplate attached to the Taliban's new office in Qatar read "Political Office of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan". This is how the Taliban referred to Afghanistan when it controlled the country from 1996 to 2001. Afghanistan also suspends long-term security negotiations with the US.

27 June

Bangladesh

The US has suspended trade privileges for Bangladesh until it improves workers' safety conditions in the clothing industry. US Trade Representative Michael Froman pointed to several recent fatal accidents in its huge clothing sector. EU action could have a much bigger impact, as its duty-free privileges specifically cover garments, which account for 60 per cent of Bangladesh's exports to Europe.

1 July

India

India's first dedicated navigation satellite, the 1,425-Kg IRNSS-1A, is put into orbit after launch from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota.

Jamia Millia University Vice-Chancellor Najeeb Jung is appointed Lt Governor of Delhi and K K Paul is named Meghalaya Governor.

4 July

Nepal

Floods and landslides kill 50, displace 12,000 people.

16 July

India

The Supreme Court allows dance bars in Maharashtra shut down seven years ago, to reopen.

14 July

India

India closes the 163-year-old Telegram Service.

13 July

Bhutan

Opposition People's Democratic Party (PDP) wins, bagging 32 of 47 parliamentary seats.

India

The reactor at the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Project attains criticality (i.e., begins to operate steadily and normally).

10 July

Bangladesh

A group of major North American retailers announced the signing of the Bangladesh Worker Safety Initiative. GAP, Walmart and 15 others signed the accord to improve conditions for workers in the Bangladesh garment industry.

9 July

Nepal

India's External Affairs Minister Salman Khurshid on a day long visit to Kathmandu.

29 July

Bhutan

PDP Leader Tshering Tobgay formally assumes the office of Prime Minister of Bhutan.

Nepal

Tiger population in Nepal goes up by 63% since 2009; reaches 198.

30 July

India

The UPA Coordination Committee agrees to the division of Andhra Pradesh.

31 July

Pakistan

Taliban raids Central Prison and frees nearly 250 of their comrades.

1 August

Bangladesh

A Bangladesh court declared as illegal the country's main Islamic party, Jamaat-e-Islami, effectively banning it from a general election due early next year. Party activists took to the streets in the capital, Dhaka, and other towns including Bogra, Jessore and Gaibandha.

India

Sujatha Singh takes over as Foreign Secretary.

3 August

Afghanistan

Three suicide attackers set off their explosive-laden car outside the consulate killing 9 civilians and wounding 24 others. No Indian officials were killed. Taliban denied any responsibility for the attack.

14 August

India

The Navy's kilo-class submarine INS Sindhurakshak sinks after twin explosions at the Mumbai naval dockyard.

12 August

India

INS Vikrant, India's first indigenous aircraft carrier, is launched at Cochin Shipyard Limited.

11 August

India

Subramanian Swamy merges the Janata Party with the BJP.

10 August

India

The compact pressurised water reactor on board India's nuclear-powered submarine, INS Arihant, achieves begins operating. This is the culmination of 25 years' of effort.

6 August

Afghanistan

Monsoons rains and flash floods across parts of Pakistan and Afghanistan killed over 130 people dead and displaced thousands. Over 70 people were killed in Kabul.

Pakistan

Defence Minister A K Anthony says ceasefire a violations from Pakistani side are double the number in January-August 2012. This comes after 5 Indians were allegedly killed by Pakistani troops.

5 August**Sri Lanka**

President Mahinda Rajapaksa attended the opening ceremony of the China-built Colombo South Harbour, which is the island's biggest port and is intended to make Colombo a strategic shipping hub.

21 August**Bhutan**

China's Vice Foreign Minister Liu Zhenmin visits Bhutan, meets PM Tobgay.

26 August**India**

The Lok Sabha passes the National Food Security Bill, 2013 after a six-hour debate.

30 August**Bhutan**

PM Tobgay makes first official visit to India. His first foreign visit since assuming office.

2 September**Pakistan**

Chair of the Developing-8 Organization for Economic Development, hosted the 33rd Session of the D-8 Commission in Islamabad. The D-8 Commissioners from Member Countries (Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan and Turkey) and D-8 Secretary-General Dr Seyed Ali Mohammad Mousavi attended the meeting. The meeting reviewed progress in intra-D-8 cooperation in several areas in the context of roadmap of cooperation from 2008 to 2018.

12 September**India**

President Pranab Mukherjee presents the Indira Gandhi Prize for Peace, Disarmament and Development for 2012 to President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf of Liberia.

Nepal

Kathmandu closes down following strike called by opposition parties in protest against government plans for elections in November.

10 September**Nepal**

Nepal agrees to enforce a UN freeze on bank accounts of over 200 terror suspects, including Dawood Ibrahim; officials however said they had no information of Dawood having any assets in the country.

9 September**Pakistan**

Mamnoon Hussain sworn in as the 12th President of Pakistan following the 2013 presidential election.

5 September**India**

The BRICS group moves towards creating a \$100-billion Currency Reserve Fund when it announces individual contribution during the G-20 meeting in St Petersburg.

3 September**India**

Chief Economic Adviser Raghuram Govind Rajan takes over as the 23rd RBI Governor for three years. He succeeds Dr Duvvuri Subbarao.

13 September**India**

A fast track court in New Delhi awards death penalty to the four convicts in the December 16, 2012 gang rape and murder case.

15 September**Afghanistan**

Lieutenant Nigara, the highest ranking female police officer in Helmand province, was shot and killed on her way to work less than three months after the July 3 assassination of her predecessor, Lt Islam Bibi.

22 September**Pakistan**

More than 80 people are killed in a double suicide bombing at a church in Peshawar; the deadliest attack so far against Christians in Pakistan. Taliban-linked Islamists claim responsibility.

24 September**Nepal**

5th Indo-Nepal joint military exercise begins in north India.

25 September**Sri Lanka**

As part of the effort to develop the tourism industry in Sri Lanka at a juncture where Chinese tourist arrivals to Sri Lanka is on a steady rise, three agreements related to the fields of education, tourism and cultural affairs were signed between Sri Lanka and China.

26 September**Nepal**

Nepal recalls its ambassador to Qatar after she compared the emirate to an "open jail" for thousands of Nepali migrants who face abuse from employers there.

3 October**India**

The former Bihar Chief Minister Lalu Prasad Yadav is sentenced to five years rigorous imprisonment, disqualified from Parliament and banned from elections for 11 years for his part in the long-running "fodder scam."

The Union Cabinet gives approval to a Home Ministry proposal to divide Andhra Pradesh and create Telangana State.

2 October**Bangladesh**

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina laid the foundation stone of the Rooppur nuclear power plant in the country's northwest, which will have two 1,000 megawatt reactors costing up to \$4 billion. Bangladesh signed a deal in November 2011 with the Russian state-owned nuclear giant - Rosatom to build the power station and has secured soft loans from Moscow to finance 90 percent of the project.

30 September**Pakistan**

Nawaz Sharif and Manmohan Singh meet in New York; agree to work towards Line-of-control (LOC) ceasefire.

27 September**Sri Lanka**

Sri Lanka celebrated World Tourism Day, with several events being held in places around the country, such as a beach cleaning programme, a tree planting programme and painting competitions for school.

India launches JENVAC, the first indigenous vaccine to protect children from Japanese encephalitis.

Economic Development Minister Basil Rajapaksa assured the government's fullest support for small and medium scale entrepreneurs and self-employed persons to start and maintain their own businesses.

6 October

Bangladesh

India's commercial export of power to Bangladesh commenced on Saturday with the inauguration of the Bangladesh-India Power Transmission Centre at western Bherampur, adjacent to West Bengal. Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and India's Power Minister Farooq Abdullah attended the ceremony in Bheramura of Kusthia district while Prime Minister Manmohan Singh addressed the event through video-conference from New Delhi. The power is being imported under a memorandum of understanding signed during Ms Hasina's visit to India in 2010.

7 October

India

Arundhati Bhattacharya takes over as the State Bank of India chairperson, the first woman to be appointed to the top job.

8 October

Sri Lanka

The sixth annual world Rubber Conference, organised by the Association of Natural Rubber Producing Countries in collaboration with the Plantation Industries Ministry, was held in Sri Lanka.

23 October

Bangladesh

The extradition treaty between Bangladesh and India came into effect with the handing over of the instruments of ratification of the much-awaited pact. The two countries will now be able to exchange convicts or undertrials as and when required. Bangladesh Home Secretary C Q K Mostak Ahmed and Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pankaj Saran signed the documents.

India

India and China sign nine pacts, including the Border Defence Cooperation Agreement, after talks between Prime Ministers Manmohan Singh and Li Keqiang in Beijing.

Pakistan

Nawaz Sharif meets US President Barack Obama in Washington and urges him to stop drone strikes.

22 October

Bangladesh

Bangladeshi and Indian officials were supposed to hold a ceremony laying the foundation stone for the Rampal power plant, a massive new coal-fired plant that will sit on the edge of the Sundarbans, the world's largest mangrove forest. However, the governments suddenly cancelled the ceremony, instead announcing that the project had already been inaugurated in early October by the countries' heads of state via a less-ornate Skype call. While the governments say the change was made because of busy schedules, activists contend the sudden scuttling of the ceremony was more likely due to rising pressure against the coal plant, including a five-day march in September that attracted thousands.

In a surprise visit to Afghanistan, John Kerry urges President Karzai to sign the security pact.

24 October

India

The Foreign Investment Promotion Board approves Tata-Singapore Airlines proposal to set up a full service airline in India.

Nepal

India resumes military aid to Nepal after nine years of suspension.

29 October

Pakistan

Prime Minister Sharif attended the 9th World Islamic Economic Forum (WIEF), Excel, London.

31 October

Pakistan

The 7th Regional workshop on Police Officers, Prosecutors, and Judges on Countering Terrorism was organised in Islamabad with the cooperation of the United Nations and the Center on Global Counter Terrorism Cooperation.

1 November

Pakistan

Hakimullah Mehsud, leader of Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) killed by a US drone attack. A week later, Maulana Fazlullah was elected by the Pakistani Taliban as its new chief.

13 November

Maldives

The Maldives has been elected unopposed to the UN Human Rights Council for a second term.

19 November

India

German Chancellor Angela Merkel is awarded the Indira Gandhi Prize for Peace, Disarmament and Development for 2013.

Prime Minister Manmohan Singh inaugurates Bharatiya Mahila Bank, the first all-women commercial bank in Mumbai.

The Supreme Court allows jailed persons to contest elections.

Nepal

Voting ends for the election of a new Constituent Assembly. Official turnout of 70%

Pakistan

Pakistan's PM visited Thailand at the invitation of the Prime Minister of Thailand Ms Yingluck Shinawatra, held comprehensive discussions on a range of issues, including enhancement of trade and investment ties.

16 November

India

Aircraft carrier INS Vikramaditya is inducted into the Indian Navy.

Maldives

Abdulla Yameen, the half brother of former strongman Maumoon Abdul Gayoom, defeated former president Mohamed Nasheed, securing 51.3% of the popular vote.

14 November

Sri Lanka

China Harbor Engineering Country signed up to build two hotels and a golf course in Sri Lanka with investment exceeding 500 million US dollars, on the sidelines of the Commonwealth leaders' summit in Colombo.

24 November**Afghanistan**

The committees underlined that inking of the agreement with Washington was in the national interest of Afghanistan and therefore should be signed as soon as possible. However, President Karzai announced that the BSA would only be signed after the presidential elections.

25 November**Afghanistan**

In an unannounced visit to Afghanistan, US NSA, Susan Rice, meets with President Karzai and stresses that the US would have no choice but to remove all troops from Afghanistan in case a BSA is not reached between the two countries.

Bangladesh

Bangladesh Election Commission announced that the 10th general election would be held on 5 January 2014.

29 November**Pakistan**

General Ashfaq Parvez Kayani retires from his position of Chief of Army Staff for 6 years. He is succeeded by Lt General Raheel Sharif.

30 November**India**

Emperor Akihito of Japan arrives in New Delhi on a six-day state visit.

5 December**India**

The Union Cabinet approves the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Bill, 2013 for the creation of a Telangana State with 10 districts, paving the way for the bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh.

11 December**India**

The Supreme Court sets aside the July 2, 2009 Delhi High Court verdict decriminalising gay sex.

Pakistan

Chief Justice Iftikhar Muhammad Chaudhry retired from his position, (tenure 2005 to 2013); Justice Tassaduq Hussain Jillani succeeded him.

10 December**Pakistan**

A meeting between Mr Shahid Khaqan Abbasi, Minister for Petroleum and Natural Resources, Pakistan and Mr Bijan Namdar Zangeneh, Minister of Petroleum, Iran held in Tehran decided to fast track implementation of the IP Gas Pipeline Project and to formulate a road map to address the challenges and have effective coordination and cooperation.

8 December**India**

In Chhattisgarh, the BJP wins a third consecutive term.

The BJP emerges as the single largest party, winning 31 seats in the Delhi Assembly elections, but falls short of majority. The Aam Aadmi Party in its first attempt at elections wins a surprising 28 seats.

The BJP scores a landslide victory in the Rajasthan Assembly polls bagging 162 states in the 200-member House.

The BJP wins the Madhya Pradesh assembly elections for the third time and gets a two-thirds majority.

12 December**India**

India's Deputy Consul-General in New York, Devyani Khobragade is arrested and handcuffed after being charged with visa fraud.

13 December**Afghanistan**

During his meeting with Prime Minister Manmohan Singh they discussed various bilateral issues, including Afghanistan's request for military hardware.

Bangladesh

Bangladesh executes Islamist leader and convicted war criminal Abdul Quader Mollah over deaths in war of independence. Supreme Court upholds death sentence on the Islamist leader of the Jamaat-e-Islami party, who was convicted in February of crimes against humanity during the 1971 war of independence. He became the first person to be executed for war crimes related to the Bangladesh Independence War, resulting in violent protests by the Islamist opposition.

18 December**Bangladesh**

The successful convening of the First Joint Study Group of BCIM Economic Corridor marked the official launch of the intergovernmental process of BCIM-EC.

28 December**India**

Arvind Kejriwal is sworn in as Chief Minister of Delhi at the Ramlila Maidan.

24 December**Bhutan**

The European Union Electoral support Team visits Bhutan

Nepal

Nepal's Maoist Party agree to join the new constituent assembly, ending a month-long political deadlock.

20 December**Bangladesh**

Bangladesh has finalised a deal to purchase two Ming-class submarines from China. The deal, which is waiting for final approval from the Finance Ministry, for the two submarines is worth \$203.3 million. It would be paid by Bangladesh during the fiscal year 2017-2018, with the submarines being delivered in 2019. Seventeen Bangladeshi sailors are being trained to operate the submarines, presumably in China.

19 December**Bangladesh**

Thousands of people stormed the Pakistan High Commission in Dhaka on Wednesday to protest against Islamabad's reaction over the execution of Jamaat-e-Islami leader Abdul Quader Molla. He was convicted of 'war crimes' in 1971, which was the first execution of an alleged war criminal in the country. The incident took place when Pakistan Parliament passed a resolution condemning the execution of Bangladeshi JI's secretary-general who was hanged on 12 December 2013. Ultimately, Bangladesh summoned Pakistan's High Commissioner in Dhaka to lodge its protest over the resolution adopted by the National Assembly of Pakistan.

5 January

Bangladesh

General elections were held in Bangladesh on 5 January 2014, in accordance with the constitutional requirement that the election must take place within the 90-day period before the expiration of the term of the Jatiyo Sangshad on 24 January 2014. The elections were controversial, with almost all major opposition parties boycotting and 154 of the total 300 seats being uncontested. 21 people were killed on polling day.

GSLV-D5 successfully launches GSAT-14 from the Sriharikota centre.

21 January

Sri Lanka

President Abdulla Yameen Abdul Gayoom departs on a State Visit to Sri Lanka.

17 January

Afghanistan

A Taliban suicide squad attacked a popular Lebanese restaurant in the diplomatic quarter in Kabul leaving 21 people dead, including the IMF country head. This was the worst attack on foreign civilians since 2001.

16 January

Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka was awarded with the "Best Travel Destination" Award at the Annual Travel Award Ceremony of the Travel and Leisure Magazine of China. The Travel and Leisure Magazine identified Sri Lanka as the Best Travel Destination through an opinion poll conducted among its Journalists and Readers in China.

12 January

Bangladesh

Sheikh Hasina sworn in as Prime Minister. Sheikh Hasina has been sworn in as Bangladesh's prime minister for her second straight term after an election marred by violence and boycotts. The new cabinet was also sworn in, during a televised ceremony in Dhaka.

8 January

Afghanistan

10th anniversary of the ratification of the Afghanistan Constitution.

23 January

Maldives

Three very important agreements were signed between the Governments of Maldives and Sri Lanka - MoU on combating Transnational Crime and Developing Police Cooperation between Sri Lanka and the Maldives; MoU for Vocational Training and Skills Development between Sri Lanka and the Maldives; and MoU on Sports Cooperation between Sri Lanka and Maldives.

25 January

Maldives

Indian government has allowed a 90-day exemption on visa for Maldivian travelling to the country on medical purposes. The restriction on a 60-day gap between two entries has also been lifted. Medical visa holders would be no longer required to report to the Foreign Regional Registration Office (FRRO) if their visa is for less than 180 days.

27 January

Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka began hosting an Asian Volleyball Technical Seminar at the Youth Training Centre (held from the 27th to the 31st of January) under the Asian Volleyball Confederation.

29 January

Bhutan

The Council of Ministers lifts the ban on the import of furniture and alcohol into the country.

2 February

Afghanistan

The start of the Afghanistan Presidential Campaign.

10 February

Nepal

Sushil Koirala, President of the Nepali Congress wins vote to become Prime Minister; backed by Communist Party of Nepal.

5 February

Afghanistan

Candidates in the Afghanistan Presidential elections have indicated that they would sign the bilateral Security Agreement should they come to power.

4 February

Bhutan

Asian Development Bank (ADB) opens office in Bhutan. ABD President Mr Takehiko Nakao visited Bhutan for the opening.

Maldives

Maldives Chief of Defence Force Major General Ahmed Shiyam made a four-day visit to India. During his visit, he met India's military leadership, including Defence Minister A K Antony and the armed forces chiefs. During the meetings, the two sides discussed ways to enhance defence ties including the steps needed for strengthening Maldivian armed forces.

Pakistan

The first ever Pakistan-Finland Business Summit was inaugurated by the Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on Foreign Affairs, Syed Tariq Fatemi, at the Serena Hotel, in presence of the Finnish Ambassador, Mr Rauli Suikannen.

15 February**Bangladesh**

An audiovisual message purported to be from al-Qaeda 'chief' Ayman al-Zawahiri urged the Muslims in Bangladesh to wage an intifada to confront the "crusader onslaught against Islam". Posted in Jihadology.net, the message alleged thousands of people were being killed in the streets of Bangladesh for protesting the "collusion of the anti-Islam secular Government with a bunch of transgressing secularists". Titled "Bangladesh: A Massacre behind a Wall of Silence", the message was released on January 14, but it surfaced in the media only on February 15.

16 February**Nepal**

Nepal Airlines plane carrying 18 passengers crashes after taking off from the resort town of Pokhara.

17 February**Pakistan**

Former president Pervez Musharraf goes on trial on treason charges.

19 February**India**

Parliament passes the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014. The act attempts to codify provisions to protect street vendors.

21 February**Pakistan**

President Mamnoon Hussain meets Chinese Premier Li Keqiang; talks of deepening strategic partnership between the two countries for socio-economic progress and prosperity.

5 March**India**

The Chief Election Commissioner of India (CEC), V S Sampath, announces the schedule for general elections. Voting to be held in nine phases from 7 April to 12 May with results announced on 16 May. Simultaneous elections for the state legislatures of Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha and Sikkim.

4 March**Bhutan**

PM Tobgay attends opening of the Third BIMSTEC Summit in Myanmar.

3 March**Bangladesh**

Bangladesh Prime Minister holds discussions with Myanmar leaders. BIMSTEC Permanent Secretariat will start functioning in Dhaka in May. Heads of states and governments from Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Thailand Prime Minister's special envoy took part in the BIMSTEC Summit in Nay Pyi Taw.

27 February**India**

Two officers die in the submarine INS Sindhuratna after a fire.

25 February**Sri Lanka**

The government rejected the United Nations' high commissioner for human rights Mr Navi Pillay's call for an international war crimes investigation into the country's civil war.

13 March**Sri Lanka**

Government data revealed that tourist arrivals in Sri Lanka rose by 27 per cent in February 2014 from a year ago, with visitor totals climbing every month.

15 March**Bangladesh**

Bangladesh deploys two patrol aircraft and two navy frigates to carry out search for the missing Malaysian aircraft.

Sri Lanka

The second phase of the Southern Expressway from Pinnaduwa in Galle to Godagama in Matara was declared open by President Mahinda Rajapaksa, allowing vehicles to reach Matara from Kottawa in one and a half hours.

19 March**Bangladesh**

Bangladeshi opposition leader Khaleda Zia was ordered on Wednesday to stand trial over charges that she and her associates embezzled about £400,000 in a case that could see her jailed for life. The two-time prime minister will go on trial from 21 April, according to lawyers at a hearing of a special anti-corruption court in Dhaka, held only weeks after her arch rival Sheikh Hasina was re-elected.

US handed over Nazmul Maksud, accused of attempting to kill Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina Wajed on August 11, 1989. Murad was arrested by the US Homeland Security Service from Atlanta on February 2, 2012.

28 March**Pakistan**

United Nation's Human Rights Council adopts Pakistan sponsored resolution on Armed Drones. An interactive panel to discuss on legal questions pertaining to this issue will take place at the 27th Session of the Human Rights Council in Geneva to be held in September 2014.

26 March**Pakistan**

Government and Taliban representatives meet in North Waziristan for peace talks, with a cease-fire at the top of the agenda.



DOMESTIC AND REGIONAL DEVELOPMENTS IN SOUTH ASIA

In FY2013/14, ISAS continued its focus on domestic and regional issues in South Asia with the following research projects:

Inclusive Growth

ISAS studied the region's overall socioeconomic trajectory and implications for stability and change in the next decade. A key thrust in this program was a study on economic drivers, rural-urban development, social media, youth, women and politics in South Asia. Also issues of religion, citizenship and minorities across South Asia were researched to better understand the changing socioeconomic patterns in the region.

Elections in the Region

This study focused on constitutional, electoral, legal and educational reforms that had a significant impact on domestic political dynamics. A study was conducted on state elections which analysed the performance of major national as well as regional parties in India. ISAS also studied the changing dynamics of state relations with the military, civil society, religious institutions and the judiciary.

Interstate Relations in South Asia

ISAS continued its study on interrelationships between states in the region, conflicts and prospects for regional cooperation. These included projects in capital markets integration and security cooperation in post-2014 Afghanistan. Combined with fieldwork, the study provided diverse perspectives and arguments for a more nuanced perspective of interstate relations in South Asia. ISAS also studied South Asia as a regional system and their interaction with the extra-region states and other actors in the international system. ISAS continued its cooperation with UN related think tanks based in New York and South Asia to assess and evaluate the implementation of the UN Counter-terrorism strategy in South Asia.

Growth-Net 2nd Annual Meeting (23-25 March 2014, New Delhi, India)

Prof Tan Tai Yong Director ISAS and Mr Lin Chung Ying Diplomat-in-Residence attended a three-day 2nd Annual Meeting of Growth Net in New Delhi. The theme of the conference was "Reviving Growth: Reversing the tide". ISAS was listed as one of the 14 institutional partners of this conference. Prof Tan spoke on "Education: Combining the government and the private sector roles to meet a national priority". There were five other speakers; among them was Mr S Ramadorai, Vice Chairman, Tata Consultancy Services and Adviser to the Prime Minister of India. About 150 participants attended the conference. It was co-organised by the Ananta Centre, which was formerly part of Aspen Institute India, and Smadja & Smadja, Strategic Advisory (established in 2001 in Switzerland and the USA). ISAS Chairman, Amb Gopinath Pillai, spoke at the first Growth Net meeting in March 2013.

On the sidelines of the conference, Prof Tan and Mr Lin met up with Mr Nikhil Sinha, Vice Chancellor of Shiv Nadar University, a private liberal arts college located in Haryana. Mr Lin paid a courtesy call on the Director of the Vivekananda International Foundation, Mr Ajit Doval. Mr Doval was subsequently appointed as the National Security Adviser in the new Modi government on 30 May 2014.

SOUTH ASIA AND SOUTHEAST ASIA

ISAS developed research outputs and conducted high-level consultations to understand the dynamics of South Asian bilateral and multilateral diplomatic relations with Southeast Asian countries.

South and Southeast Asia Engagement

ISAS continued to embark on major research initiatives by engaging regional participants through workshops, field trips and an annual South Asia/India-ASEAN roundtable. The themes that were explored included India's economic and strategic relations with Southeast Asia; the spread of Islamic radicalism from South to Southeast Asia; migration; bilateral economic ties and South-Southeast Asia cooperation. The study also drew implications for South Asia on Myanmar's democratic reforms, corporate India's inroads into Indonesia, and security cooperation with Vietnam. Bilateral and multilateral arrangements were studied in greater depth, drawing implications for ongoing regional development and stability.

Northeast Region of India (NER) and ASEAN

The study focused on NER states and the issue of connectivity with ASEAN. The research traced India's Look East Policy and prospects for sub-regional economic cooperation, people-to-people exchange, land, air and water-way connectivity. The impact of India-ASEAN FTA in fostering NER-ASEAN connectivity was also explored. Singapore's role in the growth of NER-ASEAN connectivity was also studied.

Delhi-Dialogue VI (6-7 March 2014, New Delhi, India)

The India-ASEAN Delhi Dialogue is an annual international conference of political and economic leaders, officials, academics and opinion-makers of ASEAN countries with their Indian counterparts. The forum deliberates on how to intensify and broaden political, strategic, economic and civil society interaction between India and the ASEAN region. Now in its sixth instalment, it has become an important aspect of India's 'Look East' policy as well as enabling the ASEAN region to understand the imperative for a comprehensive annual dialogue between ASEAN member states and India. The Delhi Dialogue VI was organised by India's Ministry of External Affairs, with the support of various institutes within India and the ASEAN region. ISAS was one of the partner institutes, together with the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA), the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) in India Economic Research Institute of ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA), Jakarta.

ISAS Chairman, Amb Gopinath Pillai, chaired the plenary session on Regional Architecture in Asia Pacific: Roles of India and ASEAN while ISAS Director, Prof Tan Tai Yong, made a presentation at the panel discussion - 'The Way Forward.' ISAS will continue to be involved as a partner organisation in the Delhi Dialogue process for 2015, to be held again in New Delhi, India.

ISAS-MISIS Workshop (18 February 2014, Myanmar)

ISAS collaborated with the Myanmar Institute of Strategic and International Studies (MISIS) in Yangon and organised a workshop in Myanmar. The long-term objective of the workshop is to strengthen ISAS' understanding of Myanmar's perspective of ASEAN-India relations, which is an important area of research. The workshop consisted of two panel discussions. Singapore's Ambassador to Myanmar, Mr Robert Chua, delivered the opening remarks. A panel comprising experts from South Asia and ASEAN looked

at the different aspects of security, politics and development. A second panel, consisting of experts from Myanmar provided their perspective of the Northeast.

ISAS-RGIIM-FICCI Workshop, Shillong (4 March 2014, Shillong, India)

ISAS organised a study trip to Shillong, to develop an understanding of Northeast India in the context of ASEAN-India relations. The workshop was organised in partnership with the Indian Institute of Management (IIM)-Shillong and the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and industry (FICCI). About 100 participants attended the keynote address and about 20 people attended the closed door panel discussion. The workshop held at the Rajiv Gandhi Indian Institute of Management, Shillong, India, consisted of three panel discussions. The Chief Minister of Meghalaya was the keynote speaker. Panel one discussed about the economics and business of the Northeast region and the potential role of Southeast Asia; the second panel focused on centre-state relations and how these may impact the region's engagement with external neighbours; and the final panel studied Northeast in the context of India's Look East Policy. Besides facilitating the development of a strong knowledge base on Northeast India, the trip provided an opportunity to identify and develop networks in the region.

CHINA-INDIA-UNITED STATES

South Asian Perspectives of Developments in China

As both India and China are major powers, ISAS research focused on regional perspectives on the rise of China and India as a maritime and naval power and its implications for the region. Comparative studies on 'India-China Federalism', and 'Media and Civil Society' served to better understand the growth trajectory of India and China and their competition for resources in the region.

China-India-US

Indian, US and Chinese maritime security concerns and responses, which converge in the Indian Ocean and South China Sea continued to be researched extensively. The Chinese edition of C Raja Mohan's book 'Samudra Manthan: Sino-Indian Rivalry in the Indo-Pacific' was launched in Beijing, China, in February 2014. The book is on maritime security issues impacting China, India and US relations.

SOUTH ASIAN DIASPORA

The programme consolidates research from policy, business and academic domains. The research programme develops thought leadership themes and fosters South Asian Diaspora engagement in the region.

Diaspora and Development: South Asian Diaspora Engagement in South Asia

The research programme examined existing policies aimed at engaging diaspora for development purposes. It also studied the policy context and factors that facilitated their mobilisation. It helped to provide insights into development needs and strategies to which diasporas can contribute and the role of diaspora-driven initiatives. Existing programmes and incentives in home countries that favour relations with diasporas were extensively researched.

Encyclopedic Works

ISAS aims to document South Asian transnational communities and their political, economic and cultural links with their homeland. We have published the Encyclopedia of Indian Diaspora and the Encyclopedia of Sri Lankan Diaspora. We hope to continue the research and publish on other South Asian communities in the next three years with an exhibition component that reaches out to the public.

SADC 2013

Building on the success of the inaugural 2011 convention, the second international South Asian Diaspora Convention (SADC) was held in Singapore on 21 and 22 November 2013 at Suntec Singapore. Over 1,000 participants from 16 countries attended the two-day conference. The convention brought together more than 40 of the region's leading policy makers, business leaders, celebrated authors, award winning journalists and civil society leaders for an enriching discussion. The speakers discussed and debated critical topics in business, economy, policy, and the arts that would affect the region's future and its role in global geopolitics in the 21st century. Dignitaries who graced the occasion included DPM Teo Chee Hean, DPM Tharman Shanmugaratnam, Foreign Affairs and Law Minister K Shanmugam, India's Finance Minister P Chidambaram and Chief Minister of Assam, India, Tarun Gogoi.

At the SADC 2013 Gala Dinner, Chairman of Kewalram Chanrai Group, Mr Murli Kewalram Chanrai was presented with the inaugural Outstanding Member of the South Asian Diaspora 2013 award by HE President Tony Tan Keng Yam. The Dinner was held at the Raffles City Convention Centre on the first day of the conference on 21 November 2013.

ISAS has, in recent years, incorporated the India-ASEAN relationship as one of its core research agenda. More specifically, ISAS has been at the forefront of multi-disciplinary research, analysing the prospects for enhanced India-ASEAN connectivity. In association with two other leading organisations that have made important contributions to the debate on India-ASEAN connectivity – the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) and Economic Research Institute for Asean & East Asia (ERIA), ISAS organised in Jakarta a half-day workshop on 27 August 2013 – on the theme of India-ASEAN connectivity.

The main aim of this workshop was to provide a platform for academics, diplomats and the business community in Jakarta to engage in a discussion on two major facets of the India-ASEAN connectivity theme. The first concerned the economic dimension of this interface, with a specific focus on the opportunities and challenges faced by the businesses in both India and the ASEAN countries. The second concerned the character of India-ASEAN maritime relations. By understanding India much more accurately, ASEAN member states would be in a better position to appreciate and navigate around some of the hurdles facing enhanced India-ASEAN connectivity.

Pursuing a research initiative to study connectivity between India and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), ISAS held a workshop, in partnership with the Myanmar Institute of Strategic and International Studies (MISIS), in Yangon on 18 February 2014.

The ISAS-MISIS workshop explored the mutual economic interests of India and Myanmar, such as border area development, trade, and tourism. Academics and policy makers spoke of various opportunities as well as challenges in enhancing connectivity – from leveraging the geographical contiguity to tackling security issues at the border. Many problems at the Indo-Myanmar border are common to both – insurgency, arms smuggling, low economic and social development. These could be mitigated with concerted efforts from the two governments.



Many international observers were surprised by the sudden and rapid reforms that Myanmar underwent following the controversial 2010 elections that marked the transition to democratic rule. The détente between the military rulers and the opposition National League for Democracy led by Aung San Suu Kyi played a key role in overcoming historical obstacles and reaching a common framework on which to build a bold new vision for Myanmar.

Prof Ibrahim Gambari, UN Special Envoy/Adviser to Myanmar from 2006 to 2009, was one of the key actors during the transition between impasse and rapprochement between the military and opposition. In this seminar, he reflected on his experiences and showed how the role of mediation played a crucial part in transforming the deadlock that had built up over the years. He also discussed the challenges of political and economic reforms and how the nature of this unique political transformation will affect future prospects for addressing them and the implications for South Asia.

INDIA'S FOREIGN POLICY AND REGIONAL MULTILATERALISM BY ARNDT MICHAEL, UNIVERSITY OF FREIBURG

Michael's book *India's Foreign Policy and Regional Multilateralism* won the Association of Third World Studies' Cecil B Currey Book Award and the German-Indo Society's Gisela Bonn Award 2013. The book was launched at ISAS on 26 September 2013.

The South Asian Association for Regional Association (SAARC) was first suggested by Bangladesh in 1978 and after years of negotiations, it was founded in 1985. Given this cooperative mechanism, Prof Michael asks why South Asia has not developed a NATO-like (collective security) mechanism to-date. He interviewed more than sixty decision-makers during his research to evaluate South Asian attempts at regionalism from 1947 to 2013. His fieldwork in the region was primarily in India and at the SAARC Secretariat in Kathmandu, Nepal. In his book he argues that the world has become one of regions as evidenced by the Nobel Peace Prize given to the European Union in 2012, but that South Asia's efforts at regional integration and organisation remain far behind those of other parts of the world.




Despite a growing sophistication in the study of Islam, our understanding of the religion continues to be hampered by deeply ingrained presuppositions, especially in the context of South Asian religious history. The religion has always generated interest as well as intellectual curiosity. But since 9/11 there has been a growing interest in Islam, one of the world's largest religions, and how it influences its followers. Many works of serious scholarship have appeared since then to explain the religion not only to the West but also to its followers. Riaz Hassan's book *Islam and Society* is more than another title to the growing shelf of books on Islam. The book followed by the discussion launch on 10 October 2013 explored the nexus between the ideology of Islam and Society and the importance of understanding Islam as a socially constructed reality. The discussion focused on the 'Muslim factor' in South Asian politics and other key debates about the role of Islam in the modern world.

South Asian Diaspora Convention (SADC) 2013 Media Coverage

Media coverage for SADC 2013 surpassed the coverage of the inaugural SADC in 2011, with substantial coverage in international media. The total number of media exposures for SADC 2013 was 494, which included print, broadcast, wire services and online coverage. This was about 30 percent more than the media coverage in 2011. SADC 2013 also attracted several international media, compared to only a couple of international media presence for the SADC 2011.




ISAS Outputs for FY2013/14




Published Outputs for FY2013/14

The ISAS website (www.isas.nus.edu.sg) was created in 2005 and has since grown in content with regular postings disseminated to policy makers, academic, business community and the public. The website ranks 9,914th in the world (amongst the 30 million domains) as reported by `webstatsdomain`. A low-numbered rank means that this website gets lots of visitors. It improved from the rank of 11,209 in 2012/13. About 25.9% of the website's traffic is from Singapore. ISAS web pages are ranked 6 out of 10 for accessibility and readability. The search engine optimization score has increased from 32% in 2011/12 and 46% in 2012/13 to 51% in 2013/14. The website saw a total of 33,841 visits with 21,082 unique visitors. It has registered some 101,257 page views with a duration of 2.35 minutes per page view. Every visitor had clicked on an average of 3 pages on the website.

The South Asian Diaspora website started in December 2011 and ranks 1,699,339 in the world, with roughly 425 daily unique visitors. In FY2013/14 it had registered 38,426 site visits which reflected a 30% increase from FY2012/13. Unique visitors increased by 18% and page views by 45%. The average duration of each visit was 1.5 minutes as against 58 seconds in FY2012/13.










